FNFRAL FNDOWMENT FIIND

The fund consists of generic contribution which will become part of a permanent endowment pool utilised for sponsoring research, upgrading laboratories and developing infrastructure in addition to supporting need-based scholars to ensure an ecosystem that promotes transformative education and innovative research. You can gift any amount under this header to support the university's multiple initiatives.

PECIFIC ENDOWMENT FIIND

Alternatively, partners can establish specific endowments in their names; restricted to be spent only for need-based scholarships or designated avenues. Created at a minimum of USD 25,000, a single endowment can support one scholarship seat on a permanent basis at NUST. TOWARDS A SUSTAINABLE SOLUTION

Our ultimate aim is to have at least 500 dedicated scholarship seats available each year in order to support all 61% of students who hail from marginalised segments of the nation. With USD 56 Million through support of our partners we may hope to achieve our mission of becoming a need-blind university one dav.

However, the goal in sight for the first phase is to establish 400 endowment scholarships only with 100 scholars supported in each annual intake. NUST, through collaborative efforts with national and international community, industry, and alumni, has completed more than 25% of this target with 106 seats already established, and has a pledge of an additional 111 seats.

With only USD 4.5 Million remaining for 187 seats, NEED Initiative calls out to the global community at large and seeks their support to partner with us in this endeavour of national significance. Together we can build this nation, by enabling its best brains to take the lead.

The road to economic development for any country is paved by investment in its human capital as well as innovation infrastructure. Progressive nations educate, empower, and train young minds, thus enabling them to lead. These trained young minds proactively seek solutions to current and future problems, propelling society towards progress.

Approximately 50% population of Pakistan is in maiden age segment, yet only 9% of them have access to tertiary education. Therefore, it is a consensus and not an opinion that we, as a nation, need to invest sufficiently in higher education to enable our youth as change agents.

With an aim to change the odds for 91% of the university-aged population who cannot avail higher education due to financial constraint or access. NUST has embarked on the journey of inclusive development through its NUST Endowment for Educational Development (NEED) Initiative.

NEED INITIATIVE NUST NATION BUILDING ENDEAVOUR



Launched in 2015, the initiative is built on the core mission of making NUST a need-blind university by providing education to all those who qualify on merit. Owing to the dire economic condition of the country, the merit gualifying brilliant students with financial challenges exceed 61% of the total intake every year. In order to ensure that each deserving student gets access to our classrooms, we need support from our community at large; hence, the NEED Initiative.

The ultimate goal of the initiative is self-sustainability through establishing endowment in order to surpass reliance on government, aid agencies, and philanthropists. In the first phase, NUST is aiming to establish a minimum of 400 permanent scholarship seats with 100 slots available each year of 4-year undergraduate degree intake.

In parallel, the initiative also envisions to establish the university as a worldclass institution by investing in infrastructure development, state-of-the-art laboratories, and faculty development programmes.

NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

In the last 8 years alone, NUST has disbursed approximately USD 14 Million (PKR 1.7 Billion) in scholarships. Currently, there are 1,387 students who are able to pursue their ambition of education through support of NEED partners.

However, our limited resources and funding from partners has only allowed us to support the lowest bracket among the financially challenged intake typically 17% of the annual intake. This includes, on average, 450 students every year with monthly household income less than USD 300. We do hope to extend this income cut-off range to USD 700, in order to enable maximum students each year.
