Pre-requisites: Course Description:	ARCH-263 History and Theory of Architecture I An intermediate course on history and theory of architecture. The main objective of this course is to provide students with knowledge on the architecture of Middle Ages and enlightenment. The connotation 'Middle Ages' specifically relates to the Western Historic period and would cover from Romanesque period perpendicular gothic period. The enlightenment phase would cover Renaissance, Baroque and Rococo in the western context also enlightenment phase of the Islamic era and its architectural styles (related with dynasty) shall be discussed. At the end of the course, students are expected to demonstrate a general knowledge on building types, plan typologies and architectural styles in the above-mentioned periods.
