Course ENG-412, Modern Poetry and Drama

Credit Hours: 3

Level: 7th Semester

Course Introduction:

This course aims at teaching critical analysis of modern poetry and drama, thus, developing an understanding of the aesthetic and intellectual contexts in which it was produced. The beginning and ending of modernist period are arbitrary, however, it is generally agreed that works written between 1890 and 1950 in North America and Western Europe follow the modernist tradition. The course will examine the roles of poets like T.S. Eliot and Ezra Pound, who are credited with radical shifts in style and content from their predecessors, to introduce modernist aesthetics in poetry. The students will do close reading of poems to discern differences in poetic style and idiom of authors. Additionally, the dramas suggested for this course lend a considerable amount of variety to different forms of tragedy and comedy. The course is designed to impart, discuss, evaluate, and above all enjoy the spirit of modern drama. The socio-cultural aspects of society reflected in the drama of the selected age will also be highlighted along with its significance in our modern world.

Course Objectives:

- to identify and critically examine form, style and themes in modernist poetry and drama.
- to study historical and cultural developments in which modernist poetry and drama evolved.
