## **Course Title: Seminar in Professional Ethics and Psychotherapy**

Course Code : PSY-919

Credit Hours : 3 Hrs.

Pre-requisites: Courses on Psychotherapy

#### **Course Description:**

1. The focus in this course will be to increase the knowledge and skills in the practice of Psychotherapy through a critical review of the recent work with regard to assessment and interventions for psychological problems. The dilemma faced in personal and professional life in the practice of evidence based assessment and therapeutic approaches in the context of culture will also be focused. The reading and discussion based format will encourage the student to develop his/her introspective capacity and work on their own blind spots. Through case presentation, assessment and management plans, the individual and group problems will be discussed.

### 2. Course Objectives:

- a. To develop clinical insight and ethical perspective on psychological issues faced by individuals within the socio-cultural context.
- b. To enhance therapeutic skills for a wide variety of mental health problems.
- c. To learn therapeutic techniques based on evidence based approaches.

- b. Plan and execute therapeutic intervention according to the unique psychosocial context of the individuals.
