Course Title: Advanced Developmental Psychopathology

Course Description:

1. This is a course with a research and applied emphasis. This course provides a critical examination of developmental psychopathology during childhood and adolescence, with an emphasis on the characteristics of disorders of development, their determinants, outcomes, and interventions. Current theories about research on the disorders and recent trends in intervention and prevention will be emphasized.
